Who May Apply. High school seniors graduating from one of the career programs at the Newaygo County Career Tech Center (NCCTC) and pursuing higher education through an accredited program. Students must apply during their senior year of high school.

Value. \$1,000 for post-secondary education. The scholarship may be used for **required** tuition, books, course fees, tools and equipment, certificate and licensing exam fees, and apprenticeship program fees.

Application Submission Deadline. February 28 of each year at 4 pm ET.

Online registration and login. Once registered students will be able to keep track of their information for the entire scholarship process from application to award in the online account.

- Register using the Scholarship Registration button on the lower left of the Login Page.
 1. In the Organization Name box on the registration page, type and select:
 - NCCTC
 2. Complete the remaining student personal information. Use a non-school email you monitor regularly.
- After you submit your registration information the system will email a temporary password to login to the application for the first time.

Application. Student educational information, a student personal statement (consisting of four (4) short answer essay questions), one letter of recommendation from your NCCTC program instructor, and a grade report from the NCCTC counselor are required for each application.

Selection. Selection is made based on the student's academic achievements at the NCCTC and evaluation of the student's personal statement and letter of recommendation.
